RESOLUTION NO. 1032

**RESOLUTION ALLOWING AMENDMENTS TO THE
ASSESSMENT OF PROPERTY DUE TO THE FLOOD OF 2010**

WHEREAS, Hickman County and the State of Tennessee General Assembly have an important interaction and relationship regarding the assessing of property, and

WHEREAS, in the legislative session just concluded, and as a result of the Flood of 2010, the General Assembly modified the assessment of property at the local level, and

WHEREAS, under SB No. 3687 and HR No. 3606, Senate Amendment 2 authorizes this change which must be approved by two-thirds of a county or municipalities governing body to authorize tax relief retroactive to January 1, 2010.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Hickman County, Tennessee, assembled in regular session the ___ of _____, 2010, that:

SECTION 1: Authorizes local governments to prorate a building or improvement's assessment when it cannot be occupied for more than 30 days as a result of a disaster certified by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and

SECTION 2: Requires property owners to apply for property tax relief prior to September 1, 2010.

SECTION 3: This resolution requires two-thirds vote of the legislative body of the county to be effective.

SECTION 4: This resolution shall take effect immediately.
